Established in 1964, the Student National Medical Association (SNMA) was launched as a sub-division of the National Medical Association (NMA) by HBCU medical students at Howard College of Medicine and Meharry Medical College. On October 4, 1971, SNMA became an independent corporation, having formed its original Constitution and Bylaws and filing for IRS 501(c)3 non-profit status. SNMA has remained at the forefront, advocating for the needs of current and future underrepresented minority medical students and addressing the needs of marginalized and underserved communities.

SNMA's strength has been in our commitment to serving others, and today, the SNMA includes over 8,000 medical students, premedical students, residents, and physicians among its members. The SNMA's community service and mentoring programs provide science appreciation, health care education, mentoring, and academic enrichment to elementary, junior high school, high school, and college students interested in pursuing health-related careers.

One of our foremost pipeline efforts is through the Minority Association of Premedical Students (MAPS), which serves our undergraduate and post-baccalaureate students. MAPS was nationally recognized in 1991 and spread throughout the nation with over 250 active chapters today to increase the pipeline of minorities into all health professions.





Projected Physician Shortage




AAMC - Physician Training Racial/ Ethnic Demographics

Percentage of matriculants to U.S. medical school by race/ethnicity, 2018-2019




