### PRE-HEALTH RESOURCES

As a pre-health student, it can be hard to make sense of the journey to professional school. Luckily, UCF's Office of Pre-Health and Pre-Law (PHPL) Advising has several resources for pre-health students like:

- Advising: In-person and virtual (Zoom) advising is available. Students can walk/drop-in or make an appointment.
- Mock Interviews: This is a great way to prepare for professional interviews! UCF administrators, staff, and faculty members serve as mock interviewers. Thorough feedback is provided along with a video recording of your practice interview!
- Workshops
- Practice Tests: informational workshops about the exam process for tests like the GRE, MCAT, and PA-CAT are conducted each semester. Multiple full-length, in-person MCAT practice exam sessions are also provided!
- Personal Statement Services: PHPL can helps students review and edit personal statements and/or other writing elements of their applications (not including essays).

### **CAREER SPOTLIGHT:**

#### VETERINARIAN

Veterinarians (or vets for short) are Doctors of Veterinary Medicine. They specialize in assessing, diagnosing, and treating illnesses in animals. They also administer preventative care.



Prospective vets usually earn a bachelor's degree before attending an accredited veterinary school. Veterinary medical programs are typically four years long. Students spend their first three years learning about animal physiology, anatomy, and pathology in classroom and laboratory settings. The final year is spent doing clinical rotations. Vets graduate with a VMD or DVM degree. They might spend an additional 1-5 years training in a specific specialty. To practice, vets must pass their state's licensing exams along with the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE).

It is common for vets to work in private clinics or hospitals. They can travel to farms to provide care, which means they're often working outside in a natural setting. Many vets are also found in zoos and labs.

Compassion is one trait vets should display as they deal with worried owners and distressed animals daily. Manual dexterity to perform procedures, problem-solving skills, and effective communication skills are other traits these professionals exhibit.


